PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Grace, mercy, and peace to you from God our Father in and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

"When they had lifted up their eyes, they saw no one but Jesus only." Matthew 17:8

In our day, it seems that we have bought into the idea that our life has to mean something on a grand scale so that our name is remembered. We are inspired by those who come from nothing to change the world in someway. Our children are taught that they need to have a high self-esteem.

Yet when we look at the people who have served God, they have one thing in common. They saw themselves as nothing, as nobodies. They didn't ask us to remember their name. They didn't say pray to me. They didn't say build me a monument. They said praise God. They preached that they wanted to know nothing except Christ crucified. They claimed to be unworthy to die in the same way that Christ did. They said they were unworthy to untie the sandals of Christ.

These people also had in common that they were trying to tell people not about what they had accomplished in God's service, rather what Christ had accomplished for all people. They wanted people to see Jesus only.

We have been drawn by the Father. We have been rescued by the Son. The Holy Spirit has worked in us that we might be saved by grace through faith for Jesus' sake.

Those of us who live through the late 70s will never forget the "Miracle on Ice", when the United States Olympic hockey team defeated the Soviet's hockey team.

One lesson coach Herb Brooks had to teach his players was that the name on the front of the jersey (USA) was more important than the name on the back of the jersey.

As another Winter Olympic Games begins, and in this season of Epiphany, let us bring the light of Christ to a world that needs to see Jesus, and make him our focus until the whole world hears.

Are you ready to be counted as a nobody, so everyone can see Jesus only?

Lutheran Schools Week 2022






Remember to ask: "How can I pray for you?"

+ HYMN OF THE MONTH: **O Morning Star How Fair and Bright #395**

Philip Nicolai was a Lutheran pastor who lived from 1556 to 1608. During his life he would have to flee the Roman Catholic Spaniards and battle the Calvinists over whether Christ was truly present in the elements of the Lord Supper. He was highly respected and considered a pillar of the Lutheran Church. Philip was known for his zeal to maintain the purity of Lutheranism.

Among the hymns he wrote is "O Morning Star how Fair and Bright." Words in our hymnal are regarded as a loose translation.

The hymn points to the light of Christ. Nicolai reminds us that before the foundations of the world the Father knew that it would be necessary to send Jesus to die for us. Thus our incarnate God and Savior has become our dearest treasure. We know that when our days on this earth are done, the author reminds us, Jesus is our "end and our beginning." The one who is with us at the end of the life here and the one we begin eternity with when our eyes open in Heaven. May Christ so enlightened our hearts and minds throughout our lives that we may rest in the hope of the Resurrection by looking upon one whose presence shown bright at the Transfiguration.


