PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Grace, mercy, and peace to you from God our Father, and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen

"and when He got into the boat, he who had been demon possessed begged Him that he might be with Him. However, Jesus did not permit him, but said to him, "go home to your friends, and tell them what great things the lord has done for you, and how he has had compassion on you." Mark 5:18-19

Can you imagine, begging Jesus to follow Him, to go where ever He goes, and the answer you receive is, no. Stay here. Go home. I point this out because this is what Jesus has said to most of us. This man, at the beginning, is filled with a legion of demons. He is naked, living among the dead and unable to be bound. After meeting Jesus, he is clothed and in his right mind.

He wants to go where Jesus goes. He wants to be continually in his presence.

He's not the only one is he? We often seek to continue to be in God's presence. We seek to go where He goes. There's nothing wrong with that **unless** it prevents us from doing what Christ tells us to do.

This man was naked, possessed, completely out of control and unable to help himself. Without Christ, we are no better. Now he is clothed in righteousness, healed, with the Holy Spirit working in his heart, a child of God. With Christ, through our baptism, again we are the same.

At the end of every worship service Jesus tells us, "go home and tell your friends what great things God has done for you."

I know we hear him say that through your pastor, because when I say "Go in peace to serve the Lord," you respond "Thanks be to God." We see this as an ending but really it's not. It's a beginning. A beginning to do The work we are called to do.

The remarkable part of this is, we often don't go and tell our friends the great things God has done for us. We want to be in God's presence by going where He goes but He winds up going all week to our kitchen, our living room, to take a nap, or watch TV. That is because Jesus goes with us wherever we go.

When we fall into sin, Jesus is with us. When we face trials in life, Jesus is with us. When we experience the joys of life, Jesus is with us.

Jesus tells, the formally possessed man, to stay home. The man's presence will be a constant reminder of what great things God has done. Jesus says to the man, that he should tell his friends because Jesus wants to be with the man's friends. He wants to be there in the midst of their fun and fellowship. He wants to be present at their discussions. He wants to be with them at their times of grieving. He wants to be with them in their times of joy.

Jesus wants to be with our friends as well. We don't need to go somewhere else far away with Jesus, unless He calls us to. Jesus is with us always, even until the end of the age. Wherever we are, He is there also. That's His promise.

Every week as we leave our worship service, the service in which God has given us forgiveness of sins, his word, his body and blood and so much more, let's not just say "thanks be to God." Let's live it. Let's go with Jesus somewhere He's probably not known. Let's go with Him to people who are still afflicted by their sins and have Jesus change their lives by the power of the Holy Spirit, that they may be clothed in righteousness. Stay, here in your hometown, in your own neighborhood, let your presence be a constant witness of Jesus and the great things that he has done for you. Go tell your friends. Go in peace to serve the Lord. Amen.

+ HYMN OF THE MONTH: How Shall they Hear Who Have Not Heard #831

"Go while the great commission Stands" is what this hymn encourages to do. "How shall they Hear" is just one of four hundred hymns that were penned by retired Anglican Bishop Timothy Dudley-Smith. Born in December of 1926, Smith served in the ministry for forty-two years from his ordination in 1950 until his retirement in 1992.

The hymn title and first verse are based on Romans 10:14 begging the question of how can people hear the Gospel, know they are reconciled, and trust a Savior they've never be told of.

The second verse echo's for us the great commission (Matthew 28:18-20) that Christ has given us, and the sense of urgency we must show since the time to come to faith is limited.

God's call in Isaiah (6:8) becomes the focus of verses three and four as Smith writes "Whom shall I send?....To bring the lost world home again?"

Why we do this is answered in verse five. It is the Spirit of Love moving in us.

How shall we answer the questions posed in the hymn? It is clear that God looks to us to be His hands. His feet, and His voice in this lost world. Not to use our voice in condemnation, only for the language of the law the world understands all too well. Rather, we are called to action and to go out sharing Christ with all we meet.

May God help us so to do.

Please pray for my health, both mentally and physically.




Getting to know our High School Seniors Continued...



It was the privilege of Kinsley Black and I to represent Peace Lutheran Church, at the 100th Convention of the Eastern District of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. The conference was held at First Trinity Lutheran Church in Tonawanda, New York. This congregation was one of the founding congregations of our district.

During the convention, District Pres. Chris Wicher put on all the nametags of the different events and conventions in which he represented the Eastern District. Pres. Wicher stated that moving forward we need to as a district

There was a realignment of all circuits in the district to bring us into compliance with Synodical voting circuit requirements. This will not effect the individual congregations in anyway.


Synodical President Matthew Harrison delivered a very optimistic and uplifting report. Some of the highlights of

- that report:
 - We are making such great headway in Iran that if conversions continue at the present rate or greater it is believed the Muslim regime will fall in the next five years.
 - In Germany we are seeing many Muslim converts
 - We are making inroads into Afghanistan and Pakistan.
 - For those church workers seeking reinstatement, 0 were removed or resigned originally because of sexual harassment or misconduct cases
 - The mayor of New Orleans recently stated had it not been for the Lutherans, Northeast New Orleans would still not have recovered. We restored over 6000 homes
 - We currently have 100 missionaries. They are fully funded for a year. We need to get up to 140 missionaries.
 - Prior to the conflict with Russia, the Ukrainian President had mistreated the Lutheran bishop. We have received a request for helmets and flak jackets from the government so that our pastors can take care of the people effected by this conflict.
 - In Wittenberg in an old Latin school that the Synod owns is a church plant next to the church that Luther preached at of Ukrainian refugees.
 - Because of the recent lawsuit against the Lutheran bishop and member of Parliament in Finland the church is growing.
 - In Madagascar, 4.5 million Lutherans worship on a Sunday. They do not count membership only those physically in attendance. This is more on a Sunday then ALL of the Lutheran church bodies in the United States combined. They have established 40 new congregations in the last 10 years.
 - It is likely that we will be in altar and pulpit fellowship with the Lutheran Church in Sudan.
 - 2,000 of our 6,000 congregations support our missionaries abroad.
 - The seminary in the Dominican Republic has produced over 200 pastors and 160 deaconesses.
 - The Spanish translation of the LSB hymnal has delivered 20,000 copies with 20,000 more on their way. They are being snatched up quicker and we can print them.
 - The Synod has learned that to reach the cities, the small rural and suburban congregations must be maintained.
 - In Madagascar it is common for a group to grow to 10 to 20 people and then to start a new church plant.
 - Our professors currently teach at 15 African seminaries
 - The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod is currently in the best financial state it has ever been in.
 - Concordia Nebraska, Chicago, Irvine, and St. Paul have very strong theological departments.
 - Concordia Texas no longer wishes to be under Synodical governance. Discussions are ongoing.
 - We are pulling out of the seminary in Taiwan which was a joint effort. And will be establishing a new orthodox Mandarin seminary.
 - We will be breaking altar and pulpit fellowship with the Lutheran Church in Japan who has decided to ordain women.
 - At the current time 475 congregations are without a pastor.

There was more information shared at the convention. If you have questions for Kinsley or I about a particular topic we would be happy to discuss them with you.

Finally, one special note, our own Amy Betts was elected to the position of Lay committee member for the 2025 Convention Eastern District Regional nominating committee. Congratulations Amy!
