PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Grace, mercy and peace to you from God our Father and Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

"If one part suffers, every part suffers, all the member suffer it; or if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it." I Corinthians 12:26

In Cambodia, a young girl is shot to death for wiping human spit off a Bible. In Pakistan, a former muslim cleric is arrested, tortured for a few years and then condemned to death to be hung for telling people about Jesus. In China, men come to arrest a pastor. His congregation surrounds him trying to protect him. Additional armed police are called in. The pastor is removed and the women are molested. Bibles are confiscated and destroyed.

Independence Day is my favorite holiday. I love the fireworks, the concerts, and reading the Declaration of Independence. We have a family tradition of watching the musical 1776.

As Americans we have the opportunity to worship and serve God without fear of retaliation or persecution. Preserving those freedoms has cost many dearly, starting with our founding fathers.

In many places serving Christ, studying His word, even owning a Bible is illegal.

In the Lutheran Church in Sudan, seventeen pastors serve 150,000 church members spread out among 200 congregations.

What do you think the persecuted church would say to us who take our freedoms for granted? How nice, they must think, it must be to go to Bible study and not be afraid of your door being broken down and threatened at gun point. They might tell us how blessed we are not to have armed men forcibly search our homes to see if we have a Bible with the intent of throwing us in prison or executing us on the spot. We might be told we must have the most Christians of anywhere in the world because we can tell others about Christ without fear of the death penalty.

There is a part of the body of believers that suffers daily. That is always in constant danger. We should be supporting them in prayer and by other means as God gives us opportunity.

Christ has set us free and by the power of the Holy Spirit gathering us together we are one in His church. He is the head. We are the body. Part of the body suffers for following Christ. They and we are part of the same body. What they pray to one day be able to do, we have been blessed with the ability to enjoy already. But at the very least we should not take for granted the blessings of freedom we enjoy that they are literally dying to have.

Let us make the best use of the freedoms we enjoy for Christ's sake and the sake of our neighbors and ourselves.

To witness to someone, go talk to your neighbor, relative, stranger, or friend. If you're not sure how to start the conversation ask God in prayer or ask me and I will help you.

Let's celebrate our Christian freedom and our religious freedoms in this country by fully exercising them! Christ set us free from sin and made us His own. He placed us in the world's melting pot so we could reach the nations. He made our country free that we could do His work without fear!

A Train Table or other play equipment for the Kindergarten room


Wooden puzzles and other puzzles with large pieces (24 piece maximum)

At the end of the challenge, Pastor will ask you to share some insights from the challenge anonymously for inclusion in the newsletter.

+ HYMN OF THE MONTH: #655 Lord Keep Us Steadfast in Your Word

In 1541, the Turks were on the verge of taking Vienna. German rulers asked for special prayers for protection from the Islamic attackers. Luther's response was this hymn. Luther, however, was convinced that the church was in danger from the Pope and Turk. His original first two lines of the first verse read: Lord keep us in Thy Word and work, Restrain the murderous Pope and Turk.

After the threat to Vienna ended the words were changed to speak of all enemies of God's word.

The hymn/prayer is sung with a verse directed to each person of the Trinity.

As we face such challenges in our own lives, the hymn points us to ask God to preserve what is most important. It doesn't ask to protect health, wealth, reputation, or life. It asks that we would be kept in faith and that God's word would remain among us until we are led "out of death to life."

I am currently a Chaplain in the Air Force and serve at Nellis AFB in Las Vegas Nevada. I am relatively new to the Air Force. I was a volunteer missionary in Japan for 2 and half years with my wife Nicki and then after Seminary, served at two different churches in Michigan over 15 years. I had to get an age waiver when I entered Active Duty at 43. I have 5 kids ranging from 17 to 4.


Nellis has been called the "heartbeat of the AF" by some, since we have the Weapons Schools, which train the best of the best. We are also home of the Thunderbirds and some very large training exercises that involve training with Ally nations. As a chaplain, I can be assigned to serve a variety of units, but currently I serve the Maintainers (Mechanics) who keep all the fighter jets flying. I will be moving this summer, a bit sooner than I expected, to Pope Airfield in Fayetteville, NC. It is nestled next to Ft Bragg, the largest Army Post in the U.S. and home of the 82 Airborne and Special Operations. I'll be starting up a new position there.

I appreciate your partnership and would appreciate any prayers you could offer for my upcoming move and the transition for my family. I also would appreciate prayers for the Airmen and maintainers that I care for as a new chaplain comes in. Airmen are under a lot of stress at this base and Chaplains have a very important role in caring for spiritual needs and also listening and offering advice as they navigate relationships, decisions and life.

Melisa spoke about how her christian education shaped her and her desire to serve as a Sunday School teacher at Peace. We look forward to supporting her in this new role in the fall.






